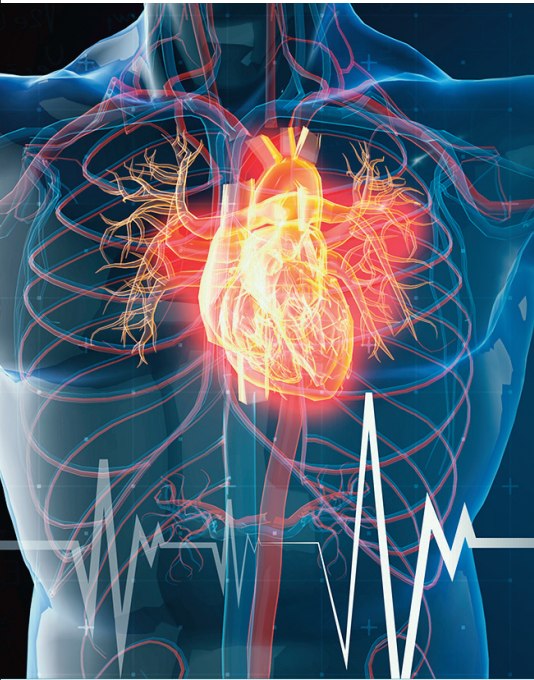

## INTENDED AUDIENCE

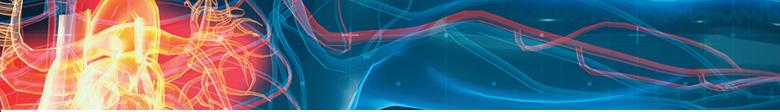
